Principal's Post

Tēnā tatou katoa e te whānau

Wow! What a couple of weeks it has been. Firstly, our thoughts go out to those areas affected by the Cyclone Gabrielle. For those of us enjoying a settled start to the school year, we can only imagine the impact yet another disrupted start is having on schools and kura in those regions. It has been great to see the thought-provoking discussions happening in many classes about how students in those areas might be feeling, and last week's bake sale was a lovely response co-ordinated by some of our Kererū students to support them. The students raised \$780 and are looking for the best way to support students at affected schools.

Yesterday's teacher's strike was a challenging one for those of us in the profession, especially in the middle of a campaign to raise attendance and engagement in schools. The decision to strike is one that was not made lightly. Thank you for supporting us. The key issues at the heart of the industrial action are more than just teachers' and principals' pay. There are fundamental inequities of funding within the system that need to be addressed, particularly with regard to the support of students with additional learning, social, emotional and behavioural needs. These are issues that have been raised during negotiations of the last three collective agreements, but coming out of Covid the needs of our learners have grown so significantly that we cannot compromise any longer. I sincerely hope that this message does not get lost amongst the calls for better pay and conditions, and that the Ministry looks beyond calls for better pay.

Come and join the Kelly Sports coaches for the best in sports fun. We have some exciting days planned including:


