Principal's Post

Tēnā tatou katoa e te whānau

Like many of you, the team at Redwood were all hoping that there would be an announcement about a change in alert levels last week. Sadly, this was not to be. We are hopeful that a change may come during the upcoming school holidays, so that we can start Term 2 with some more normal school systems and routines. Please keep an eye out for any emails over the holiday break outlining any changes to the way we will be operating.

One of the events we are hoping to go ahead with in Week One of Term 2 is our annual cross country event at Redwood Park. We hope that a change in settings will allow us to have parents cheering on their children as usual. We have planned to have this event on Tuesday 3rd May or Wednesday 4th May depending on the weather.

We have been steadily managing Covid-19 cases and are pleased to see the majority of our positive cases back at school, happy and healthy. To date we have had 113 student cases and 9 staff cases. We have found it interesting to note that when there have been a couple of cases in Year 1-3 classes then there seems to be a few more students getting it within that learning space. This has not been as evident in our Year 4 -6 classes, which suggests that the wearing of masks really does slow the spread of Omicron. It will be very interesting to see if there is a change of guidance around mask use in schools if we move to the Orange setting of the Covid Protection Framework.

One of our staff who did, unfortunately, catch Covid was Caitlin Roberts. Fortunately, she managed to do this the week prior to her wedding. Congratulations to Caitlin and Toby. We now have another Mrs C. Arlidge on the staff!

Last week, Pūkeko Syndicate ventured to Te Ngahere O Tawa. This was a follow up trip to the one last week to Willowbank Park, and is part of their Turangawaewae unit connecting the Pūkeko students to their local environment, awa and maunga. A big thank you to all the parents who were able to support this trip, it was very much appreciated by the Pūkeko teachers. We are hoping that this year we can get out and visit locations that bring learning to life, as this has been a real challenge for the last couple of years.

It was great to have some feedback from my last newsletter article about reading, behaviour and gaming. Judging from the comments there are definitely a few people with concerns around the impacts of gaming and the reading habits of their children. As a parent of teenagers I have seen their love of reading decrease over time - if only my 15 year old loved reading as much as my 10 year old! I did receive some responses challenging my connection with young students gaming habits and their learning and behavioural difficulties at school. Whilst my belief around this comes from my experience over 25 years of teaching, it is also backed up by research and neuroscience. As a Deputy Principal I worked with some students who at the age of 7 were completely addicted to gaming and were completely obsessed with death and violence. Through trying to support these students I was fortunate to work with some specialists in trauma-based medicine and learned about how the brain develops and works, and the impacts gaming can have on developing brains. I have included an adapted presentation (with additional notes) I presented at the education conference ULEARN in 2018 around this very subject, which also includes a very fascinating video from Kathryn Berkett's TEDX Talk on 'Digital Zombies'.
