The Syndicate Leader, Deputy Principal or myself are always available if the concern cannot be be resolved or if the compliment needs to be shared.

You will all, no doubt, have seen that education is very much front of centre in the media as the government have made a series of announcements regarding teaching and learning, attendance, and lunches in schools.

Whilst we are not a school who qualifies for the School Lunch programme, we are fortunate to have the support of the Take 10 charity in providing fruit, bread, cheese, spread and other items that we support our students with if their lunchboxes are looking a little light.

On the whole our attendance is not too bad compared to other schools, but we still sit at 25% of our students not meeting the 90% attendance that the MOE constitutes as regular attendance. A large factor in this is overseas holidays or long weekends away. We expected this number to climb as seasonal illness kick in with the change of temperature.

The big announcement from last week was regarding the mandating of Structured Literacy as the teaching methodology for teaching literacy for Years 1-8. At Redwood, we have been utilising Structured Literacy Approaches for the last 18 months in our Junior School, building on the strong phonics programme already in place. We are continuing to build on this in other syndicates and are part of an RTLB Structured Literacy pilot, which is primarily focussing on supporting the implementation of this approach in Years 4-6. The Science of Learning pedagogy that sits behind this directive has been something we have been exploring and learning about for the last couple of years and We feel well placed to adopt any directives from the Ministry in this space.

Term 2 is a term where we share information with you about your child's progress at school. This year this will be continuing to use the HERO app to share learning information, as well as having face to face Parent / Teacher Conferences. At the end of Week 4 you will get a post in your child's Learner profile describing how they have settled into school, such as: information about their learning habits, friendships, attitude towards learning etc. much like a general comment. Later in the term we will update students' RED Values goals and provide learning levels in Reading, Writing and Maths, prior to the Parent / Teacher Conferences in Week 10. We hope you find all this information useful and informative about how your child is doing at school.
