The Syndicate Leader, Deputy Principal or myself are always available if the concern cannot be resolved or if the compliment needs to be shared.

Coming home today is your child's Mid Year Summary Report. This gives you an update on your child's progress against curriculum expectations in Reading, Writing and Maths, and has a General Comment which may discuss their behaviours and attitudes in class, as well as giving more detail about their learning in the key curriculum areas. The report builds on the conversations you had at the beginning of the term at Parent / Teacher Conferences. We hope you enjoy sharing your child's successes with them.

I'm pleased to be able to announce some progress in a variety of property projects, that should mean some actual action in this space before the end of the year. Over the coming holidays there will be some initial work on our Fire Alarm upgrade, which should be completed over the coming months. We are one of three schools getting a full Fire Alarm upgrade funded by the MOE in the Wellington area. We are also due over the coming weeks to have all our heat pumps replaced and upgraded. I will be meeting with the MOE over the holiday break to see the first design plans and proposals for all our weather tightness work, and also have a meeting to discuss the next phase of our A Block classroom renovations. The second half of the year could be a busy one for property at Redwood School!

This week I received notification from Wellington City Council of the public consultation of traffic changes in Oriel Avenue, including broken yellow lines and median crossing barriers. This proposal was initiated by last year's Room 16 students during their InSTEAD project looking at safe travel to school. Many students identified that Oriel Avenue was too wide and dangerous for children to cross safely, inspired by a letter sent by a Year 2 student at the time. Their study was submitted to WCC for consideration. This is a great example of students showing community action, and it would be fantastic if this proposal came to fruition enabling students to be able to walk safely to school. 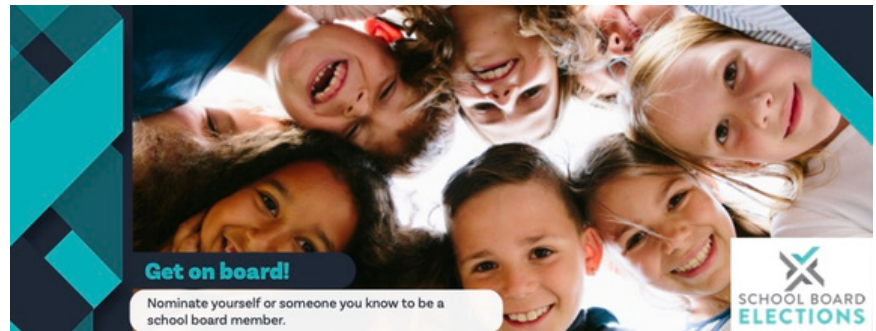
